### Large Turnout Of Freshmen Highlight Election Of '56

Scores of colleges across the country operate their own radio stations and Lowell Technological Institute, in forefront of educational institutions of its type in the nation, is among the many that operate a station. The station's call letters are, naturally, WLTJ, and the programs carried, boomed only to the LTI campus. Students at LTI thoroughly enjoy the station's programs and a survey in radio would probably show that LTI students listen to their own stations more than they do to regular commercial stations. The station is the result of the planning and drive of a group of radio-minded students. They won official permission to start two years ago and although they started with the barest minimum of equipment, they have gradually expanded, adding top equipment and recordings, financed chiefly by social affairs sponsored by the station. The station effectively mixes education and entertainment.

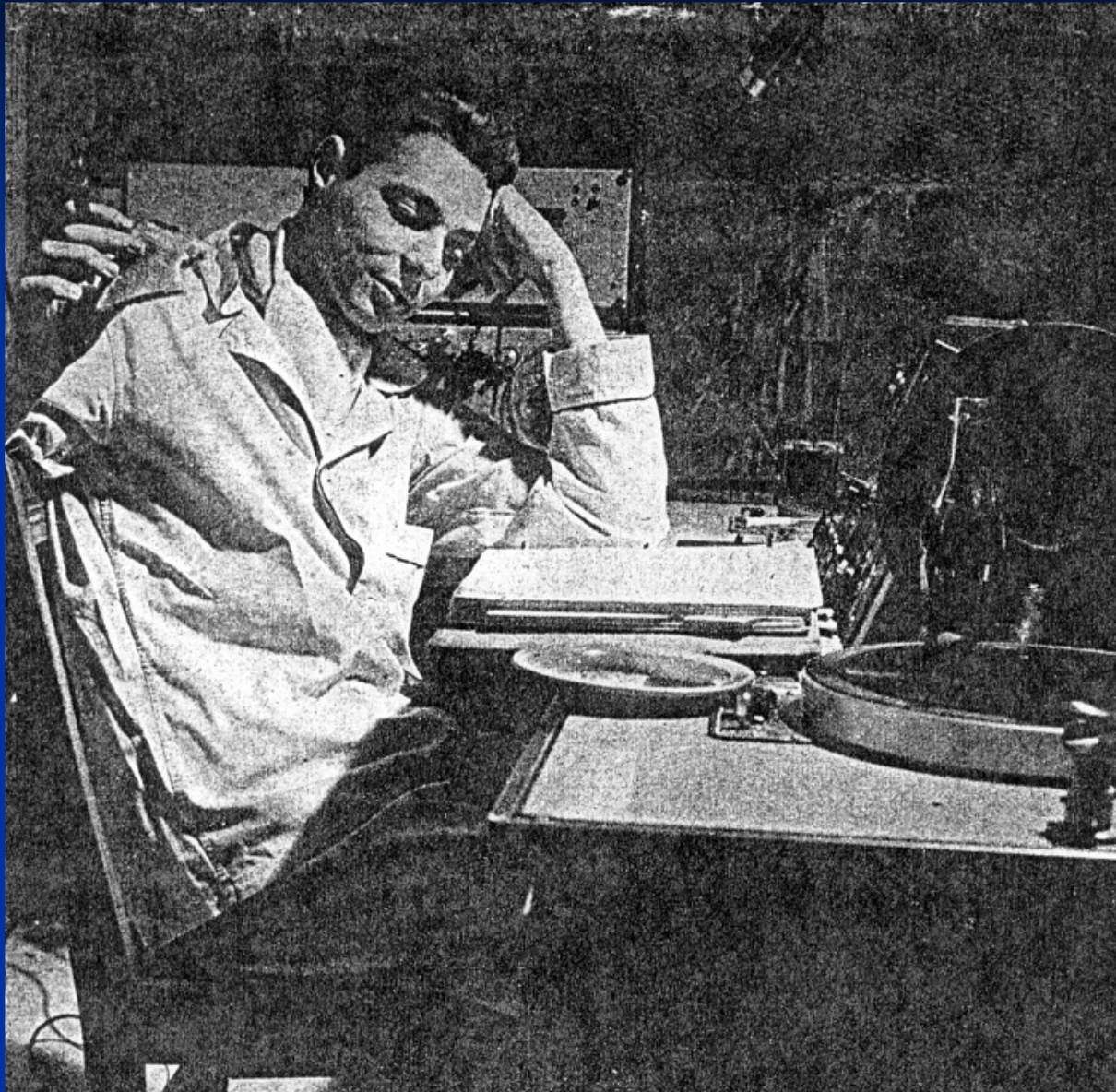

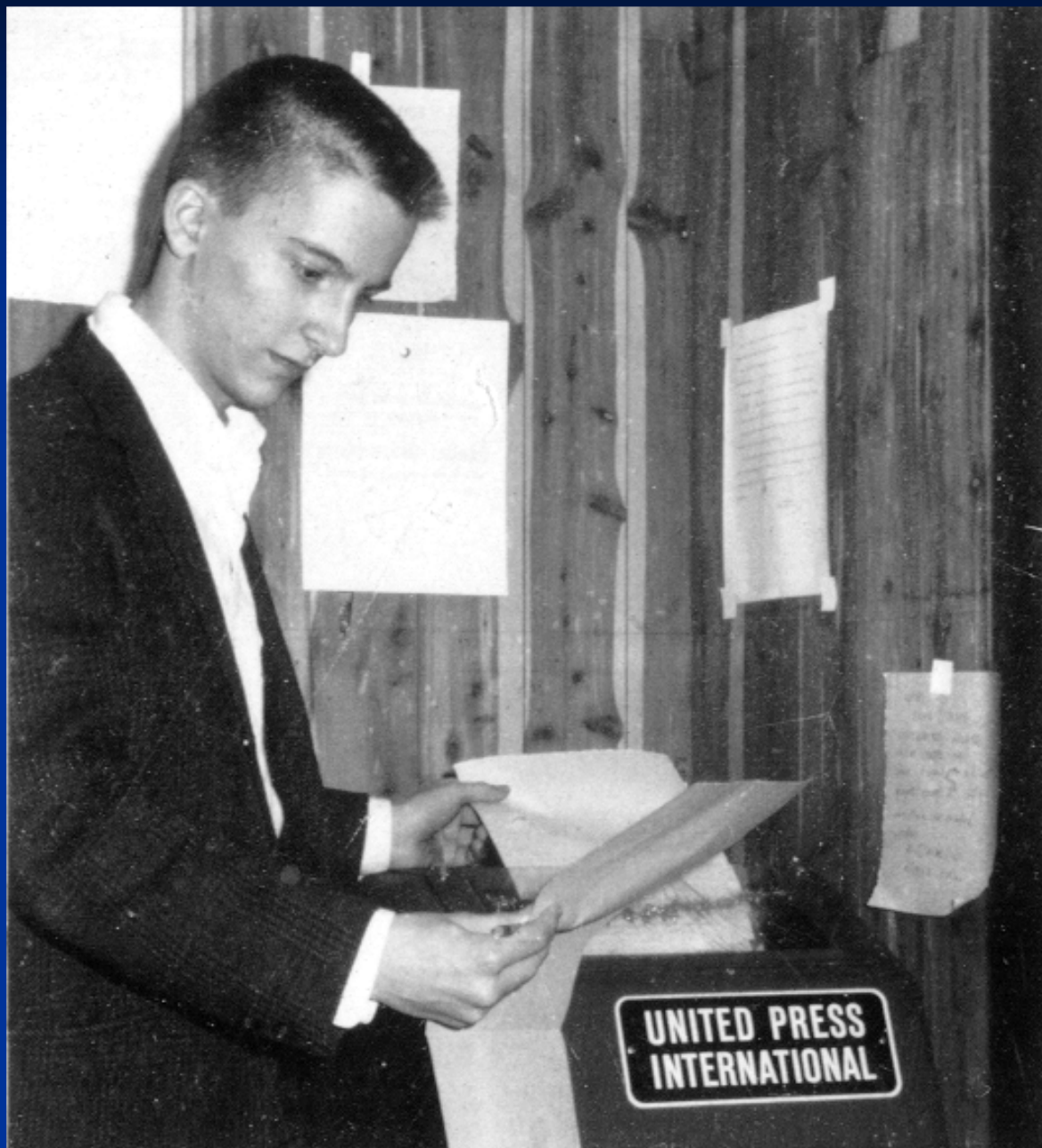

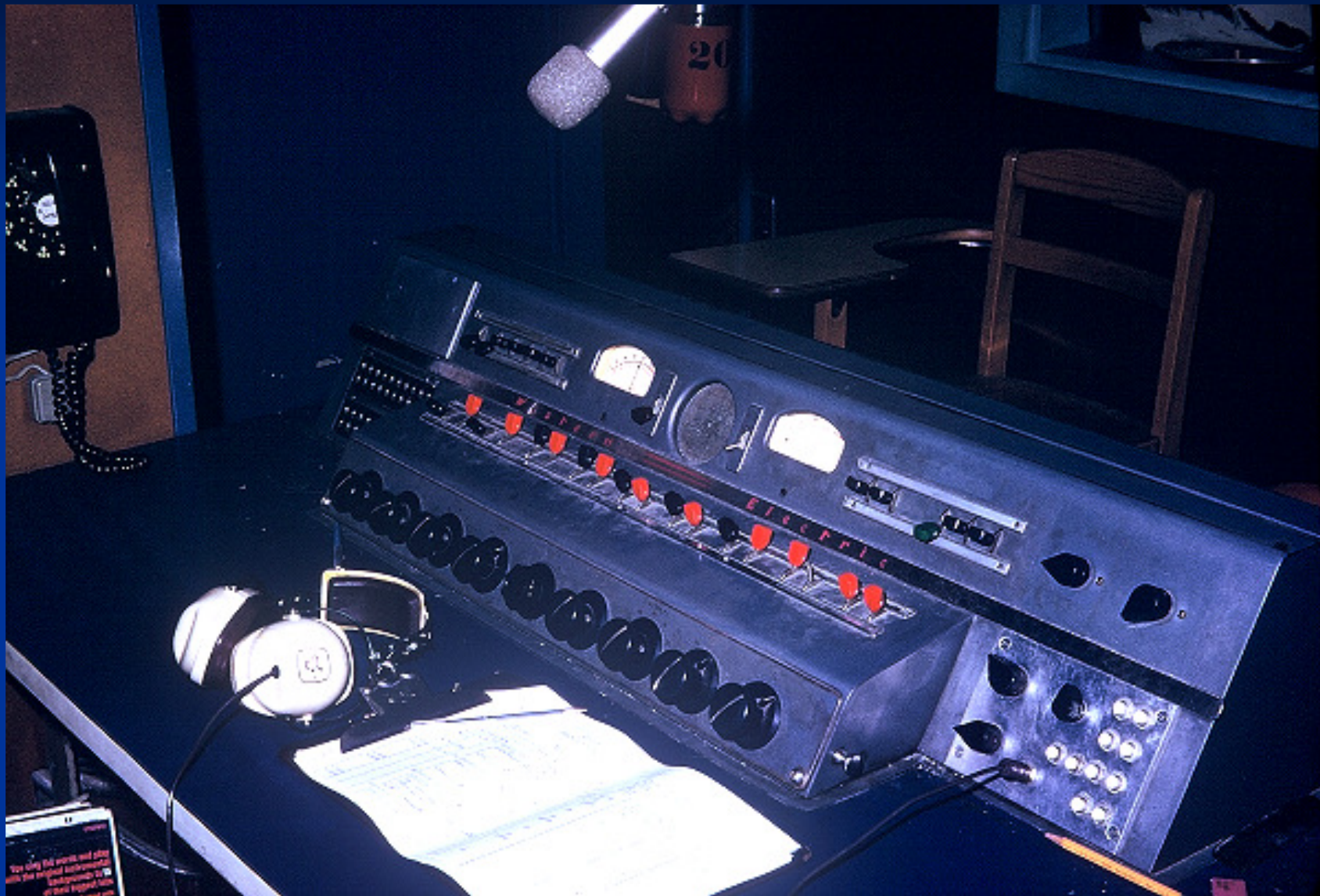

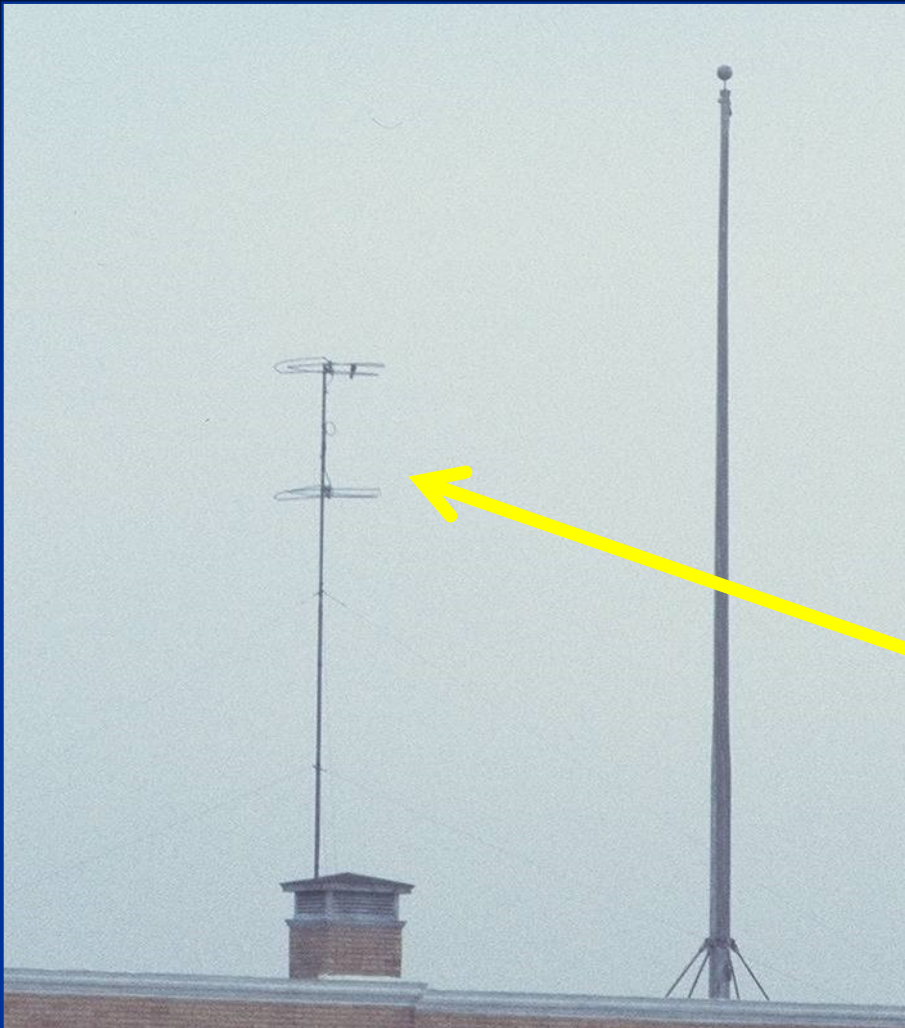

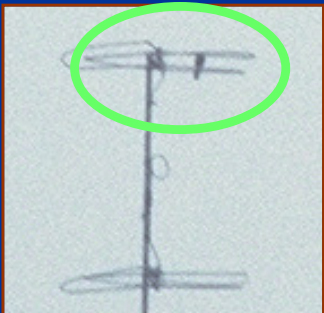

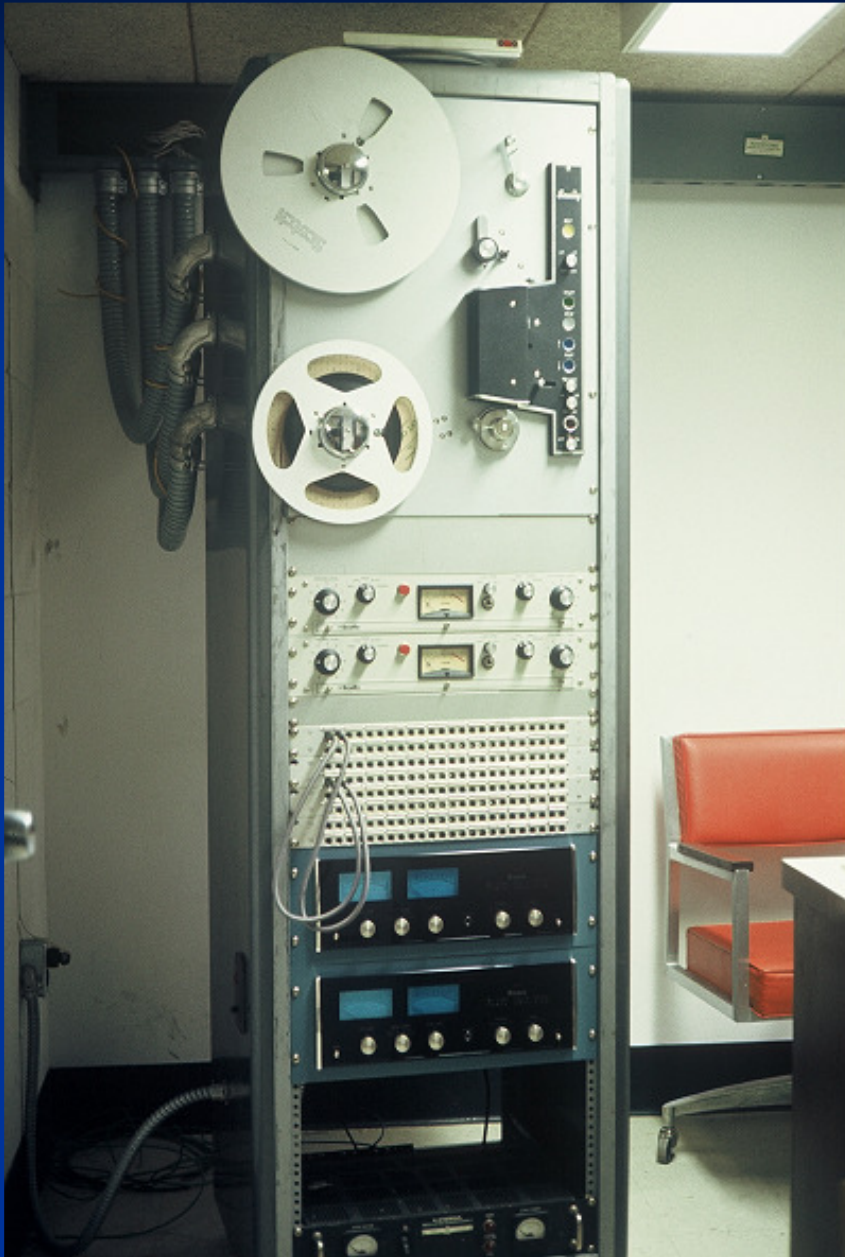

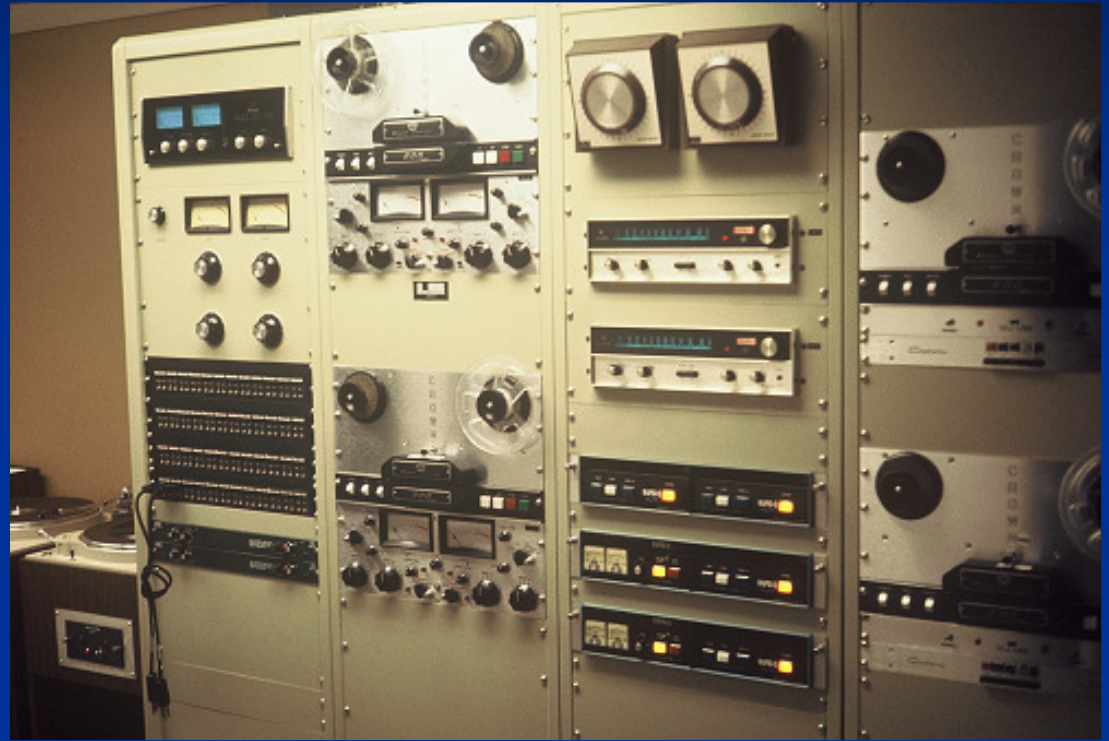

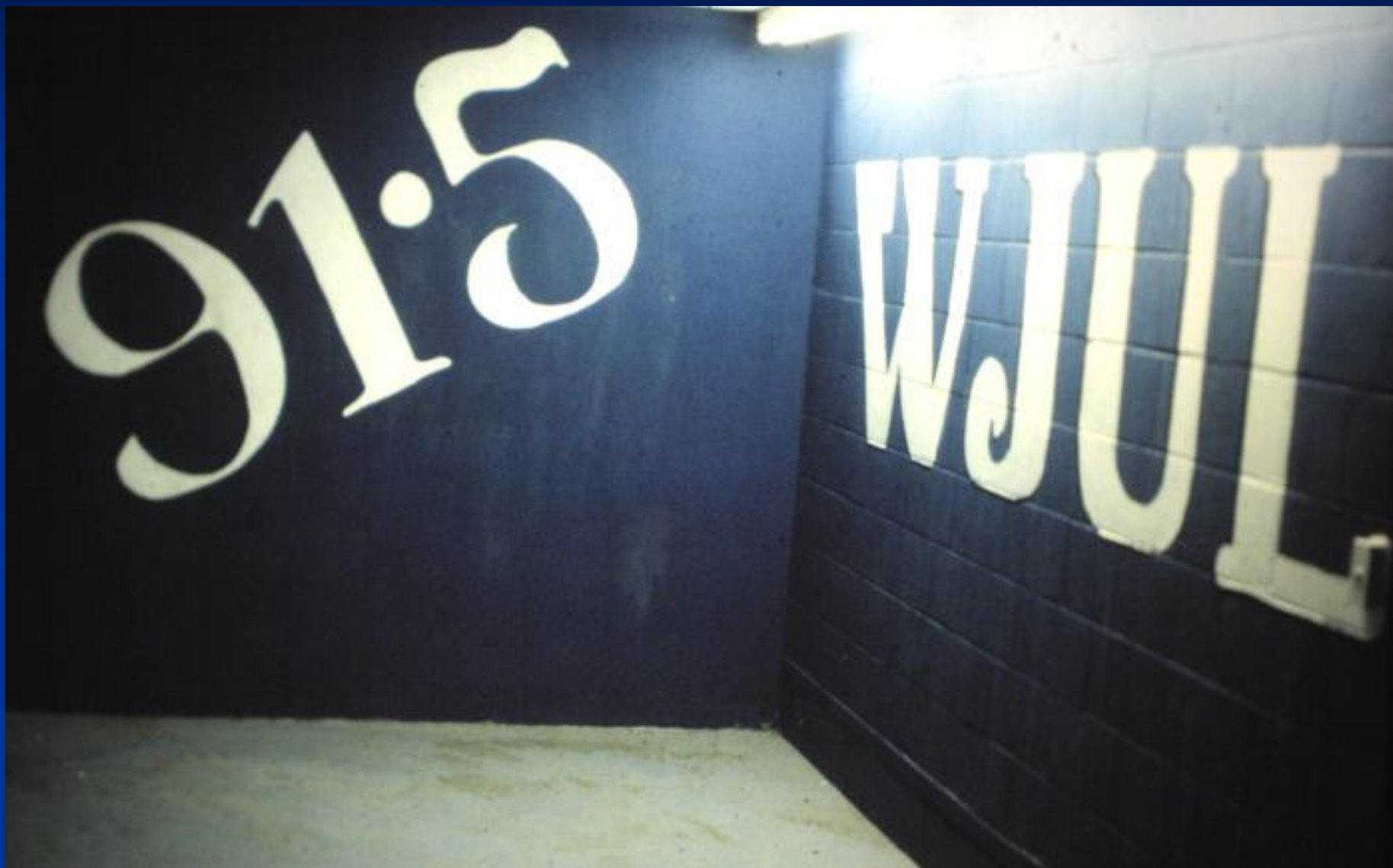

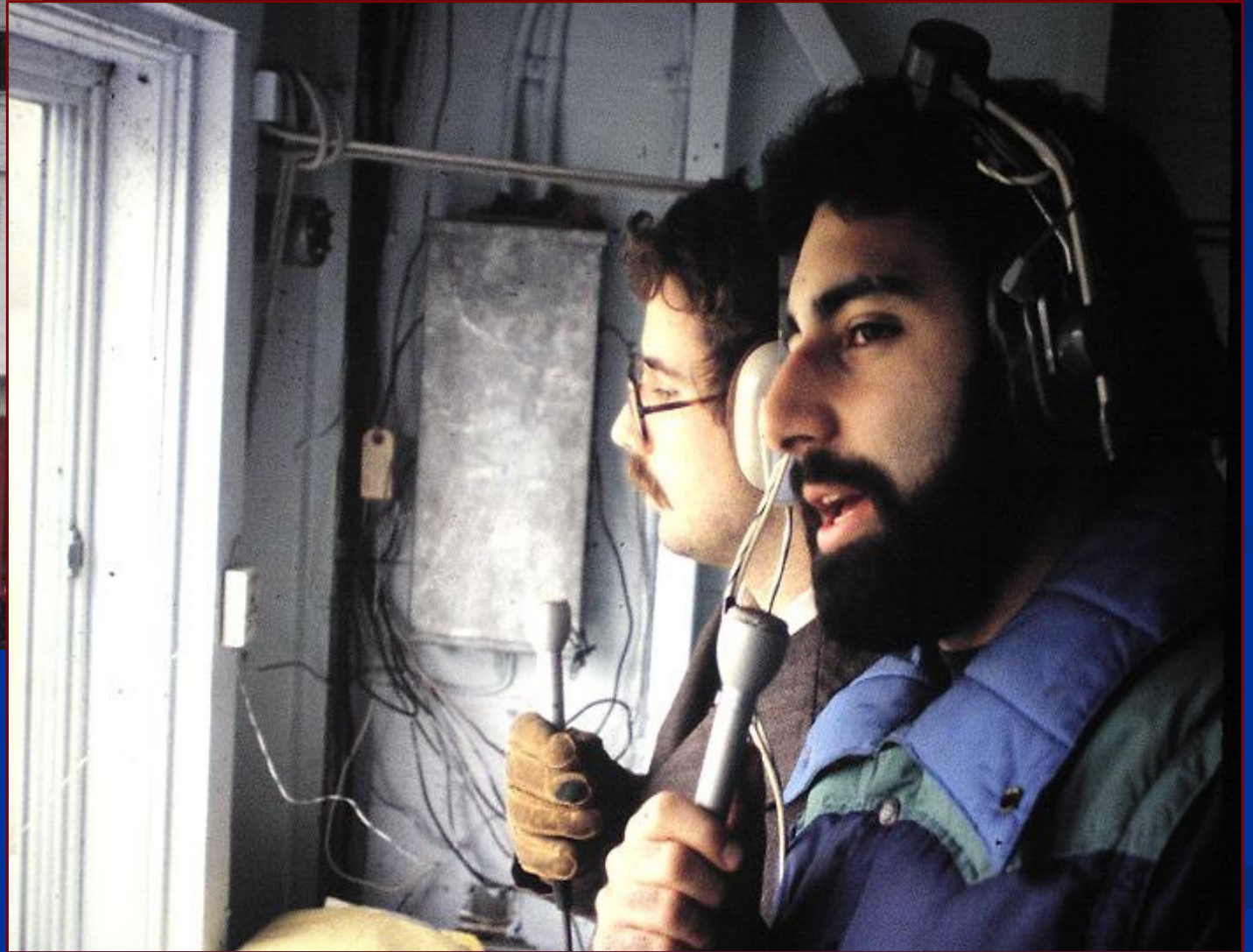

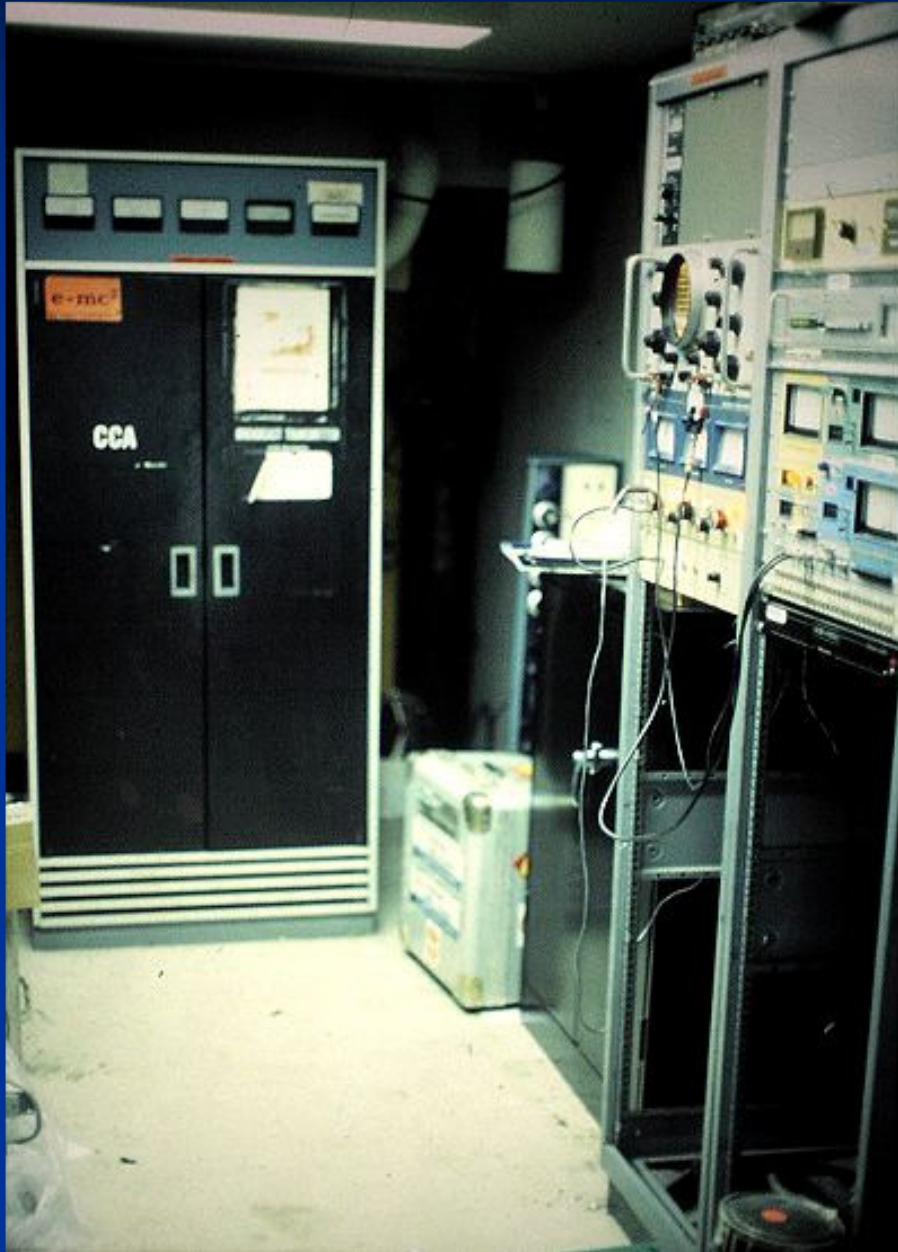

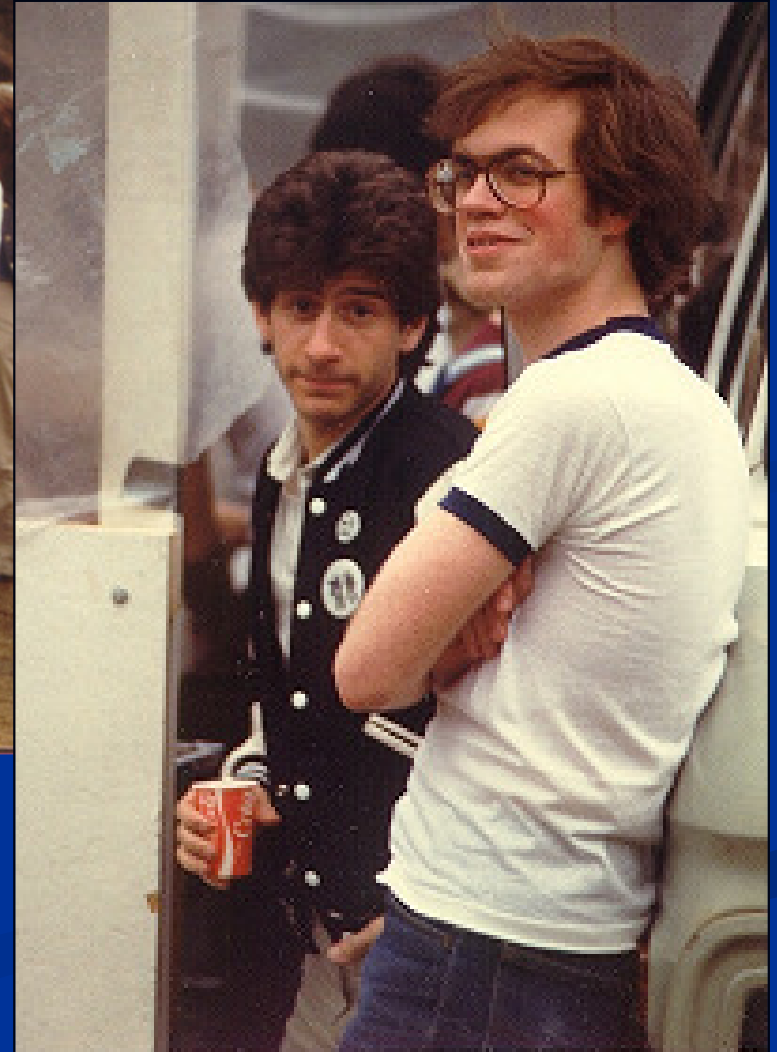

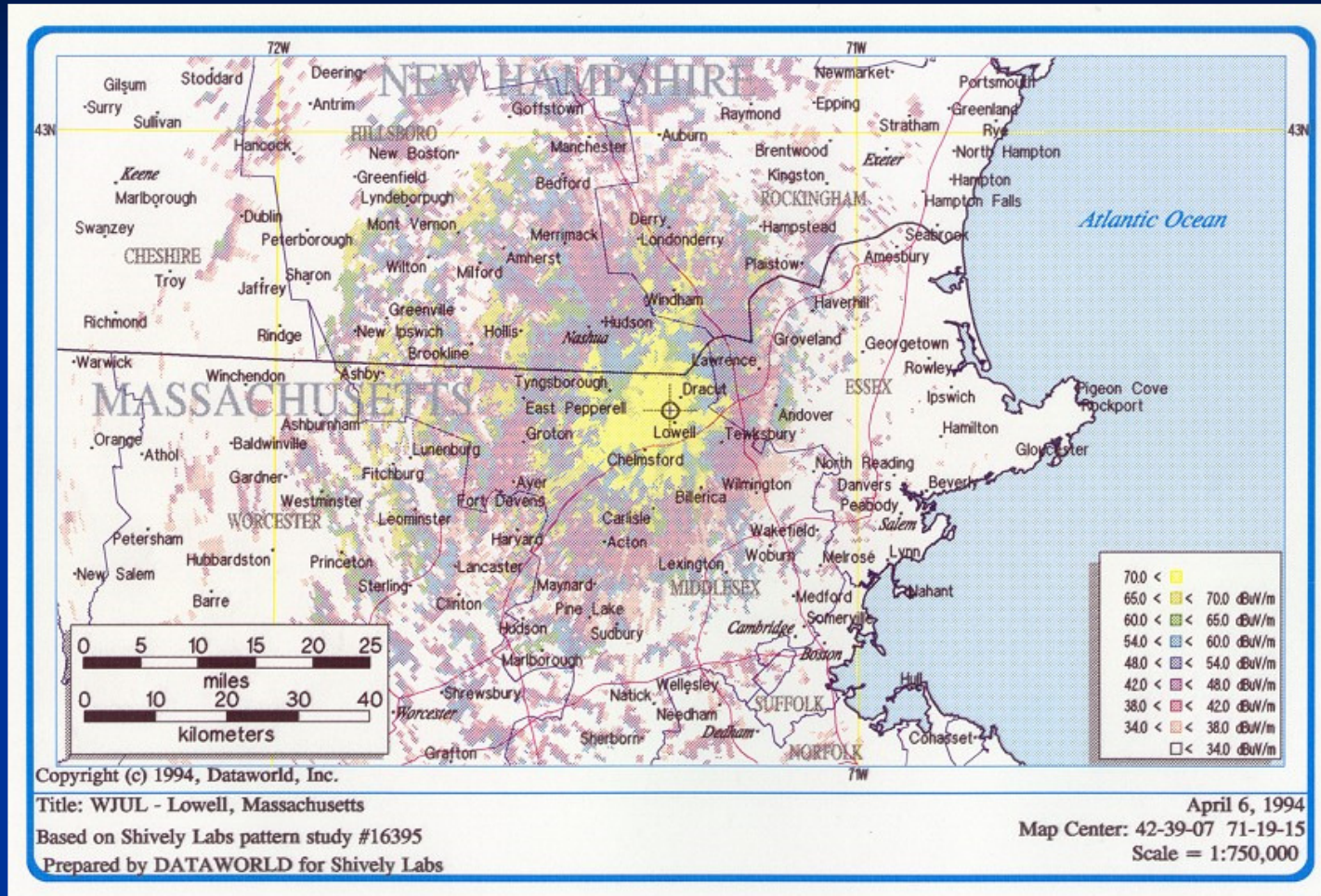
Trivia

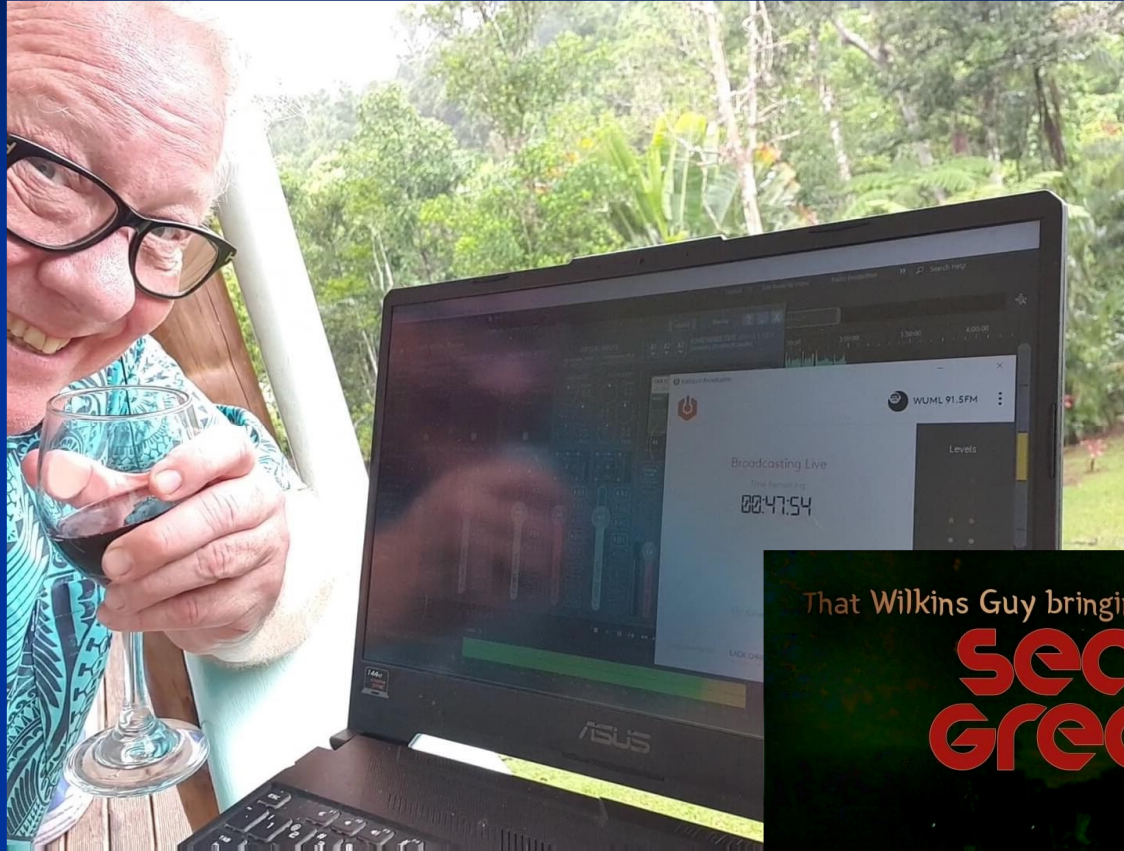
